



# **Directions to Ertegun House**

Ertegun House is located at 37A St. Giles', Oxford (OX1 3LD) and is just a few minutes walk away from the Oxford bus and coach station, and about 10 minutes away from the railway station.

## **By Bicycle**

There are bicycle racks near Ertegun House in St. Giles'.

### By Car

The recommended approach to Ertegun House is from the north on the A4165 Banbury Road or A4144 Woodstock Road, both of which are accessible from the ring road. If using the M40 from the north leave at Junction 9, but from the south-east leave at Junction 8. Ertegun House has no car parking facilities, although on-street metered parking is available on streets nearby but it can be difficult to find a space.

### Park-and-ride

There are five <u>park-and-rides</u> (some are free but not all) available on the outskirts of Oxford which are all serviced by regular bus services to the centre of the city. Whilst the park-and-rides are open 24 hours/day the bus services do not run 24 hours/day.

## By Train

There are frequent direct trains to Oxford station from London Paddington and regular links northwards via Birmingham, southwards via Reading, and westwards via Didcot. The station is a 15 minute walk from Ertegun House or there is a taxi rank at the station. Click <u>here</u> for a map with directions to Ertegun House from the train station.

## By Coach

There are very frequent services from London Victoria Station and operated by the Oxford Bus Company ('X90') and Stagecoach ('Oxford Tube'), as well as from <u>Heathrow and Gatwick</u> <u>Airports</u>. The central bus and coach depot (Gloucester Green) is a 10 minute walk from Ertegun House. Click <u>here</u> for a map with directions to Ertegun House from the main coach station.

#### By Air

London Heathrow is the most convenient airport and there is a frequent coach service to Oxford (see above). London Gatwick is further but there is also a direct coach service to and from Oxford. Birmingham International, Stansted and Luton have less frequent coach and/or rail connections with Oxford.
